***UNINSTALL THESE MALICIOUS ANDROID APPS ***

Researchers from Dr. Web have found nine apps with more than 5.8 million combined downloads that were sneakily stealing user's Facebook passwords using a genuine Facebook login page. As of writing, Google has banned the developer and removed these nine apps from the Play Store, but if you've downloaded any of them, it's time to change your passwords.

According to the <u>researchers at Dr. Web</u>, the developer, chikumburahamilton, created fully functional apps for photo editing, exercising, horoscopes, and junk cleaning (among others). After a point, these apps would prompt users to log in using Facebook to unlock the full functionality of the app.

When users did that, the app would kick in their own C&C server (a Command-and-Control server controlled by the developer used to copy and store data from a webpage). After receiving the settings from the C&C server, the app loaded then loaded the legitimate Facebook login page.

Then, the app loaded the JavaScript received from the C&C server into the Facebook login page (JavaScript code is versatile and can be inserted at any point, even when a user just taps on a text field). This Javascript code was then used to copy the username and password.

The JavaScript then passed the copied data to the application, which in turn passed it to the app's C&C server, where it was saved. Once the user logged in to the application, the app also stole cookies from the current authorized session, which were in turn sent to cybercriminals.

In this instance, the apps only used Facebook's genuine login page. But because of the way JavaScript and C&C servers work, they could have easily done this with any service requiring you to log in.

What can you do about it?

The first thing you should do is to check if you were running one of these nine apps (and their functions):

- 1. PIP Photo (image editing)
- 2. Processing Photo (photo editing)
- 3. Rubbish Cleaner (device optimization)
- 4. Inwell Fitness (health)
- 5. Horoscope Daily (astrology)
- 6. App Lock Keep (child safety tool)
- 7. Lockit Master (child safety tool)
- 8. Horoscope Pi (astrology)
- 9. App lock Manager (child safety tool)

If you have any of these apps installed, the first step is to uninstall the application.

Then, if you used Facebook login with the app, you need to reset your Facebook

password immediately.

Next, stay vigilant. Use a trusted anti-virus application like <u>Malwarebytes</u> to detect apps with malicious code. If possible, avoid connecting third-party services like Facebook with random apps downloaded from the Play Store. Because of the way Play Store works, it's trivially easy for developers to reenter and resubmit apps even after they are taken down (a developer license only costs \$25).

Lastly, turn on <u>two-factor authentication</u> for any site that allows it, and pair it with a <u>password manager</u>. This will help you generate and store long passwords securely. And even if a website leak reveals your password, two-factor authentication will protect you from hackers.

* THE NANO-VECTOR NETWORK ANALYZER*

Many have purchased these analyzers. They come in a variety of models depending on your needs. They can do a simple to quite extensive analyses of your antenna or network system.

Of course, I am focusing on the simple.

Many of us have these to check our individual antennas. Looking forthe resonant point and why possibly the SWR is not as low as we would like it at resonance. The VNA is capable in determining this in most cases.

Setting Up the Analyzer.

The VNA comes with some hardware. Three terminations, open, shorted and load. It also has two short lengths of RG/405 coax and a coupler. You will need to acquire adapters if you are using UHF or other connectors than SMA. One adapter is at the VNA side and another at the end of the coax you are using.

For a common antenna installation Port 1 (S11) or output port will be the only one to use. Port 2 (S21) is a receiving port. Connect one RG/405 to Port 1. This will eliminate a strain on the VNA connector.

Put the adapter you need for your coax on the RG/405. Connect your coax. The antenna end of the coax should be open or not connected. Put another adapter on the end of your coax.

Now you can turn the VNA on.

With the stylus touch the right side of the screen to bring up the menu. Select "Stimulus".

Select "Start". A numbered key pad comes up. Select the lowest frequency you are testing. For example, if you are testing a 40 meter antenna, you may want to select 7M. This is 7 MHz. Then touch "OK". You will see 7.000 Mhz on the bottom left screen.

- Back to the menu. Select "Stop". Enter 7.3M, then OK. You will see 7.300 MHz on the right bottom of the screen. You can expand or reduce the span as needed.
- On the end of your coax, put the "Open" terminator on. Open your menu. Go back one step so you can see "Cal" and select it. "Calibrate" is on the next window, select it.

Next menu will have "Open" at the top. Select it and wait until it is finished.

Exchange the "Open" terminator for the "Shorted" one. Select "Shorted" Do the same.

Exchange the "Shorted" terminator for the "Load". Select "Load". Do the same.

Go back in the menu. Back again. Select "Recall/Save". Then select "Save". Save your data in one of the "Save files (0 - 4). This way if you turn your VNA off you will not loose your calibration.

Return back to the main menu and select "Display". Select "Format". Select "SWR".

Now you can connect the antenna. The SWR graph of the antenna under test will display. It is measuring values of the antenna using that specific length and type of coax. How did you do? Need to see or do more? In a future article there will be more information.

* INTERNATIONAL LIGHT HOUSE WEEKEND *

From the International Lighthouse Lightship Weekend website: <u>https://illw.net/</u> Normally held on the 3rd full weekend in August 00.01 UTC 21st August to 24.00 UTC 22nd August 2021 (48 hours)

For some reason or other August seems to have become the international weekend for lighthouses. Countries all over the world have become involved in one form or another of lighthouse activity. Some years ago the United States Congress declared August 7th as their National Lighthouse Day and during that first week in August amateur radio operators in America set up portable stations at lighthouses and endeavour to make contact with each other. This event is known as the US National Lighthouse Week.

In Britain the Association of Lighthouse Keepers, <u>ALK</u>, conducts International Lighthouse Heritage Weekend on the same weekend as the ILLW in August. Their objective is to encourage Lighthouse managers, keepers and owners to open their lighthouse or lightstation and related visitors centres to the public with a view to raising the profile of lighthouses, lightvessels and other navigational aids, and preserving our maritime heritage.

However, the major event which takes place in August is the International Lighthouse Lightship Weekend, ILLW, which came into being in 1998 as the Scottish Northern Lights Award run by the Ayr Amateur Radio Group. The history of this event can be found elsewhere on this site. The ILLW usually takes place on the 3rd full weekend in August each year and attracts over 500 lighthouse entries located in over 40 countries. It is one of the most popular international amateur radio events in existence probably because there are very few rules and it is not the usual contest type event. It is also free and there are no prizes for contacting large numbers of other stations. There is little doubt that the month of August has become "Lighthouse Month" due largely to the popularity and growth of the ILLW.

MICROSOFT TO REMOVE BLUE SCREEN OF DEATH IN WIN 11

In Windows 11 Microsoft has eliminated the Blue Screen Of Death (BSOD)! Nothing else has changed, same errors, same screen, except it will be black and white ;-) Now how is that for an improvement.

Windows 11 has been released to the guinea pigs (Beta testers) so it is real and on its way. Windows 11 will be a free upgrade from Windows 10. Windows 10 is scheduled for end of support in 2025. The regular computer requirements are pretty much normal for a new system with the exception of the Trusted Platform Module (TPM version 2.0) which is a security feature which you may have it your computer is reasonably new. Also Windows 11 does not support 32bit systems, 64bit only.

SPACE STATION TO TRANSMIT SSTV THIS WEEKEND

Friday and Saturday, August 6 – 7, Russian cosmonauts onboard the International Space Station (ISS) will transmit slow-scan television (SSTV) images from the station on 145.800 MHz FM. They will use SSTV mode PD-120. The transmissions are part of the Moscow Aviation Institute SSTV experiment (MAI-75) and will be sent via RS0ISS, the ham station in the Russian Zvezda (Service) module using a Kenwood TM-D710 transceiver.

The announced schedule is August 6, 1050 – 1910 UTC and August 7, 0950 – 1555 UTC. Dates and times are subject to change. For stations in the ISS footprint, the RS0ISS signal should be easy to copy on a handheld transceiver and a quarter-wave whip. Use 25-kHz channel spacing, if available. Free ISS software is available to download.

<u>Pass predictions</u> are available from AMSAT two days ahead of the pass. Representative images from prior ISS SSTV events are available in the <u>ARISS SSTV</u> <u>Gallery</u>.
