# **\*TRAVEL SITE TYPO REVEALS SECURITY LOOPHOLE\***

#### INFOPACKETS by John Lister

Travel site Booking.com says one customer getting access to another customer's bookings was not a security breach. The problem appears to be a system that was set up without considering the possibility of human error.

Website Arstechnica.com reported the case of a customer identified only as "Alfie," who received a confirmation email for a trip he knew nothing about. He was surprised to login to his account and find the details of the booking. (Source: <u>arstechnica.com</u>)

After Alfie made multiple enquiries to Booking.com's support staff, he received no useful response. He then reported the situation to Arstechnica, which also took "weeks" to get a proper response.

They explained the problem was simple: another customer had mistakenly typed Alfie's email address while making an online reservation. It appears the two customers had similar email addresses that meant a simple typo (and the fact they both had accounts with the site) was enough to cause the error. (Source: <u>techradar.com</u>)

The way the site works meant the booking was automatically added to Alfie's account. To make things worse, Booking.com said it was unable to remove the trip from his account, citing a violation of the privacy of the actual user - something that doesn't really make much sense. Instead the only option was for Alfie to manually delete the trip himself which, thankfully for the real customer, he did only after the travel dates had passed.

Pressed on the problem, Booking.com reportedly said there was nothing to fix as the system was working as designed and there was no security breach. That may be the case, but there certainly appear to be data protection issues. Curious about the implications, Alfie asked Booking.com to "confirm" details about the booking and was given identifying personal information about the real customer.

Alfie also noted that although there's no obvious way for somebody acting maliciously to start this process, it's a matter of luck whether the unintended "recipient" of the booking was good-natured. He pointed out that a less charitable person might have cancelled the trip.

# \* GM ORDERED TO STOP SELLING TRACEABLE DATA\*

Many modern cars have the ability to track usage data, and General Motors was recently caught selling that data to other companies. Now the US has ordered GM to stop that.

The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) of the US has barred General Motors (GM) from selling sensitive driver data to consumer reporting agencies for the next five years. The decision comes after a lengthy investigation sparked by a *New York Times* report revealing that the automaker was <u>secretly collecting and selling detailed information</u> about drivers' behavior, including location data and instances of speeding, hard braking, and late-night driving, to data

brokers. This data was subsequently used to generate risk profiles for insurance companies, leading to increased insurance premiums for some drivers.

The FTC's research found that GM collected this data from millions of vehicles equipped with OnStar Connected Services and the Smart Driver feature "without adequately notifying consumers and obtaining their affirmative consent." The FTC also condemned GM's lack of transparency, stating that the automaker "failed to clearly disclose to consumers the types of information it collected," including that this sensitive data would be sold to consumer reporting agencies. These agencies then used the data to compile reports that impacted insurance rates and coverage decisions.

It should be noted that the company can still share anonymized driving data with third parties, such as road safety researchers, but at least they won't give data brokers driving data that can be tied back to you. And even if you don't want this anonymized data to be shared either, GM is also required to make it easier for drivers to disable location tracking and access and delete the data collected about their driving. So your car will probably still try to track you, but it will be easier to keep it in check. This will presumably come as an update to your car's infotainment system, although we're not exactly sure when that will roll out.

# \*MICROSOFT OFFICE WILL NOT BE SUPPORTED ON WINDOWS 10 \*

Microsoft will stop supporting Office apps on Windows 10 beginning October 14, 2025, coinciding with the operating system's upcoming end of support.

"Microsoft 365 apps will no longer be supported after October 14, 2025, on Windows 10 devices," the company announced today. The apps will continue working after the cutoff date, but there are no guarantees. End of support means just that—Microsoft will stop updating Microsoft 365 apps for Windows 10 systems, and there could be some repercussions. LibreOffice and other alternatives will likely support Windows 10 for a while longer, or you can keep using the web app versions in a supported web browser. The recent standalone Microsoft Office 2024 package is available for Windows 10 and will be supported for at least a few years (Microsoft doesn't have an exact end-of-life date right now).

Indeed, according to <u>Microsoft's support page</u>, there might be "performance and reliability issues over time" with these apps. "To use Microsoft 365 applications on your device, you will need to upgrade to Windows 11," the company noted. If you choose to do that, all Microsoft

365 features and security updates will continue working as usual, and your Office apps will continue receiving updates with new features, fixes, and security patches.

Microsoft 365 is already unsupported on Windows 7, Windows 8, and Windows 8.1. Microsoft ended support for Windows 8 on January 12, 2016, and Windows 8.1 on January 10, 2023.

ALSO: The Microsoft 365 Personal and Family plans are going up in price, in part because they now include Copilot AI features. Existing subscribers can opt out if they are on recurring billing. That makes the individual Microsoft 365 Personal plan \$100/year or \$10/month, up from \$70/yr or \$7/mo. The Microsoft 365 Family plan is now \$130/yr or \$13/mo, up from \$100/yr or \$9/mo. However, existing subscribers with recurring billing enabled can switch to the new Personal Classic or Family Classic plans. The cheaper Microsoft 365 Basic plan with 100GB storage and no desktop Office apps is also an option for \$2/mo or \$20/yr.
